Dear PB Family,

I am delighted to have your family attending Most Precious Blood School for the 2017-2018 school year. The purpose of this letter is to share news and dates for next school year.

Registration and picture day is scheduled for August 4th, 9:00AM-1:00PM and 3:00PM-6:00PM. At registration, you will be able turn in or complete all paperwork for the school office, sign up for HASA events, order and size uniforms, gather athletic information, meet a school board representative, ask tuition questions, and students will have their school picture taken. This is a day to complete many necessary items for the school year. The 2017-18 registration day paperwork is now available on the webpage under the Forms and Handbook tab.

Back to School Night for grades 1-8 is August 14. Back to School Night begins at 6:00 PM in the gym. Following a short school wide meeting, there are classroom presentations. Parents are invited to have the opportunity to meet directly with each of their children's classroom teachers. Parents will learn procedures and expectations of the classroom. Kindergarten Round-Up (4:30pm) and Preschool Orientation (5:30pm) will be held on August 10th. These dates are also supply move-in dates.

The first day of school is Wednesday, August 16th, for grades K-8. The Gym (Door #5) will open at 7:30am for early drop off. Any grade may use early drop-off and the gym door for arrival. Students gather in the Gym, by grade level, and are supervised by school staff until the first bell at 7:45. PreK and K Students may enter the building at 7:45am through Door #2 (Barthold St.) School instruction begins at 7:55am. Please make every effort to be on time for school. We are continuing to focus on raising attendance and reducing tardiness. School will dismiss at 2:50pm. Preschool and Kindergarten will dismiss to Door #2 off Barthold Street. Grades 1-8 will dismiss to the rear parking lot.

We are excited for the 2017-2018 academic and spiritual school year. We will expand our one to one computing with our incoming 6th grade students. All students in 6th and 7th grade will have a personal Chromebook for educational use. Students use the Chromebook to complement and enhance their traditional classroom education. Each year students entering the 6th grade receive a device for educational use. We also have a new portable Chromebook lab. The portable Chromebook lab will allow students in K-5 to have more access to electronic education in the classroom. Teachers and students will be able to use the portable lab for AR testing, NWEA testing (this test will replace STAR testing), Study Island, Raz-Kids, CANVAS, and much more! The portable lab was an action item from our strategic plan and made possible by the technology fee.

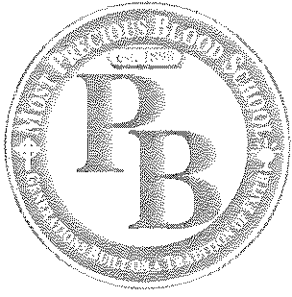

- **You will need to enter bank information and choose a payment date (the 5th or 20th of the month)**

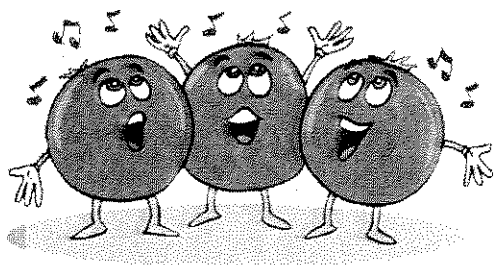

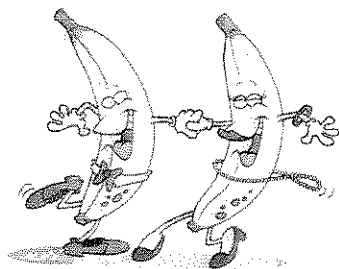

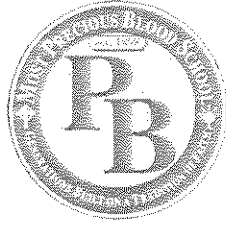
Here is a list of what will be at the School Lunch table on Registration Day:

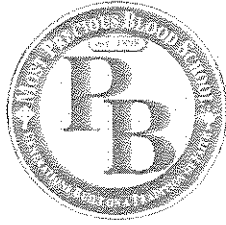
